Annie transitioned to her heavenly home on November 9th, 2021. She was born on July 16th, 1946 to the late Annie and Walker Carter in Richmond County, Virginia.

Annie graduated from Richmond County High School as valedictorian of her class. She received a Bachelor's degree in Business Administration from Virginia State University. She later pursued post graduate studies in General Administration at the University College in College Park, MD.

Annie joined Mt. Zion Baptist Church in Farnham, Virginia at an early age and later attended New Southern Rock Baptist Church after moving to Maryland. She became a member of Mt. Jezreel Baptist Church in 1986. She loved helping others in her community. Annie became one of the founding members and Treasurer of the Community Outreach Program at Mt. Jezreel after attending a Church Alive Conference by the late Pastor Trammell.
