Arrie M. Thomas (Pee Wee) was born on April 18, 1933, in Oxon Hill MD. She was affectionately known as Granny to everyone in her neighborhood and church. She was one of 12 children to include her twin (Helen M. Hill) born to Charles and James Anna (Mama Jim) Quarles who preceded her in death. At a young age, she moved to the District of Columbia and was educated in the Catholic School System. She was united into holy matrimony in April of 1959 to John Harley. They became the proud parents of one daughter Antoinette Mc Neely. He later preceded her in death. In early 1983 she married her beloved James Thomas, Sr. (Bae, as she called him) and after 16 years of marriage he also preceded her in death.

Arrie worked various jobs in the Washington Metropolitan Area to include: The University of Maryland, Gallaudet University and The Architect of the Capital from which she retired after 14 years of dedicated service. She would tell everyone about God's goodness by stating "God is Good all the time and all the time God is Good". She loved it when someone would read the bible to her and pray with her.

Granny was very well known in the Trinidad neighborhood where she lived for so many years. She would sit on the front porch as she spoke and waved to everyone whether she knew them or not.

All day and every day when anyone walked by her home, they would stop and take the time to ask how she was doing and to talk with her a bit.

Arrie was preceded in death by her two brothers and seven of her sisters to include her, twin Helen. She leaves to cherish her memories, three daughters Antoinette McNeely, Vivian Shepherd and Sylvia Harley; one son James Thomas, Jr; two sisters Nellie and Virginia; grandchildren Karen (Eric), Tyler, Demarco and Dominique; Great grandchildren, Gerard (Brittney), Tylen and Deshawn; and a loving host of relatives and friends remembering that Love, Loves.
