Bertha A. Holman lived a life rooted in love, faith, and heartfelt connection. Her joyful spirit brought warmth to every room and comfort to all who knew her. She passed away peacefully at her residence on January 29, 2026.

Born the first of nine children to the late Walter Anderson Sr. and Julia Scott Anderson, Bertha was raised in Midlothian, Virginia (Hallsboro), where a simple country upbringing shaped her strong values. She was educated in Chesterfield County Public Schools and graduated from Carver High School in 1958. Soon after, she married the love of her life, Herman. Together they welcomed two beloved children, LeAnn and Greg, and made their home in Washington, DC, building a life centered on family, faith, and fellowship - filled with dancing, laughter, and joyful gatherings.

She enjoyed reading, from the daily newspaper to the Word of God, and delighted in television, magazines, and ordering special finds from catalogs. Thoughtful and attentive, she was especially known for sending greeting cards. If you knew Bertha and she had your mailing address, more than likely you received a card from her at some point in your life. She meticulously took time to address each envelope with care. Rarely missing an occasion, each card was a reflection of her kindness, intention, and unwavering love for others.

Bertha gave her life to Christ at an early age. A faithful and devoted member of First Rock Baptist Church in Washington, DC, Bertha's life reflected steadfast service. For more than 40 years, she served as a Deaconess - including Chairman of the Deaconess Board and Superintendent of Sunday School - and supported the church through the Daycare Board, Flower Ministry and Lady Guy Missionary Ministry. Beyond the church, she was a member of the American Legion Auxiliary. She retired as House Director from Careco Mental Health Services, Inc., where she compassionately served adults with intellectual and developmental challenges.

Bertha also took great pride in her appearance and was always well groomed. She kept her hair its infamous cinnamin red, her nails neatly done, and delighted in wearing fancy hats to church - each one worn with grace and confidence.

Throughout the years, Bertha found joy in keeping a close bond with all her siblings, cherishing the lifelong connection they shared, and often taking a short trip down I-95 South to visit. While she deeply treasured her family, the true light of her life was her granddaughter, Haleigh. When Haleigh was born, she felt a joy she had never known - a love that brought new depth, pride, and happiness to her heart.

Bertha was preceded in death by her parents; her beloved husband of 58 years, Herman Holman of Ashland, VA; and her brothers, Walter Jr., Raymond, Marshall Sr., and Warren Anderson.

She leaves to cherish her memory her devoted daughter, LeAnn Holman; her endearing son, Gregory Holman (Nurlene); her beloved granddaughter, Haleigh Holman; sisters, Helen Ross and Carolyn Harris; brothers, Bernard Anderson (Charlene) and Jeff Anderson; aunts, Nancy Vaughn (Thurman) and Geraldine Clarke; sisters-in-law, Sharon Anderson and Inge Holman; uncles-

in-law, Frankie Miller and Freddie Mushaw; along with a host of nieces, nephews, relatives, and dear friends. The family extends special thanks to Mary Ann Stanfield and her daughter, Shawn Stanfield, for their devoted care and companionship during Bertha's illness.
