“ Hello, I am Cindy Proctor. I am not much of a public speaker. But here goes. I am one of the many volunteers who had the privilege of working with Betty through the VITA Program and Prince George’s Cash Campaign. VITA and TCE volunteers serve the community by preparing taxes free of charge for seniors and low-income taxpayers, joining thousands of others across the country who help millions each year.

*I am not even sure what led me to volunteer at Prince George’s Community College, but it turned out to be both a blessing and a calling. That is where I met Betty. She was a professor there and had established a free tax program for seniors and low-income families. I was fortunate to work alongside her for more than 15 years through the VITA program. When COVID hit, we worked together to create and co-coordinate the virtual tax program.*

*After retiring from Prince George’s Community College, Betty continued her work through Prince George’s Cash Campaign. Because of her dedication to seniors and low-income taxpayers, she established tax assistance sites at six public libraries and one church, serving the community in Prince George’s County for more than 25 years.*

*Over time, we became more than coworkers; we became friends. Sadly, we shared a personal loss, as both of our husbands passed away during different years of tax season. Her brother lived in the Northern Neck of Virginia because my husband and I bought a home not far from where he lives, so we also shared many conversations about that area. Yes, we even talked about politics.*
