Daniel Erick Nicolas was born on July 31st, 1985 in Washington, DC. He was the second child of Yvon and Elvie Nicolas. Though Daniel, affectionately known as “Dada” was the middle child of his family, he wore many “hats”, one of which was being the protector of his family. This was a position he took very seriously, yet on the other hand he also was the unofficial comedian of the family. He was well known by friends and family for his keen sense of humor. He loved to tell jokes and play pranks. Daniel attended primary and secondary schools in Montgomery County, MD and he graduated from Montgomery Blair High School in Silver Spring, MD. Daniel was an art enthusiast and enjoyed creating in different mediums: watercolor, acrylic and charcoal to include a few. Daniel also was passionate about music. In his younger days anywhere he went he was sure to carry his disc player and headphones. He loved to spend time with his family and seeing people happy. He was a great gift giver. He made sure to take his time and put in extra consideration when choosing a gift for a loved one. Daniel was also very competitive and active. He would participate in family game nights and video game competitions; with just one functional hand he could beat those that thought they were the best. Daniel had a fearless attitude and loved trying out new things. He didn't allow his condition to define him. He loved hard and made sure you knew you were loved by him. Daniel was born with sickle cell anemia. He spent his entire life battling this disease and the toll it took on his body. At the young age of 4 years old Daniel suffered his first stroke which led to his left arm no longer

being functional. Daniel went through numerous tests, trials and studies to find ways to correct his arm and cope with this disease. This was the biggest struggle of his life. On the morning of Wednesday, October 14, 2020 at 12 am, Daniel Erick Nicolas went on to be with the Lord. Daniel was predeceased by his grandmothers on both sides: Amélie Joseph (Elvie) and Marie Lea Odette Nicolas (Yvon) who are waiting to welcome him with open arms. He is survived by his father Yvon Nicolas, his mother Elvie Nicolas, his siblings; Marie Michelle Nicolas, Emmanuel Nicolas, Margarete Acevero (Solomon), Marjorie Vandy (Augustine), his nieces; Amonnie, Amber, Jolie and nephews; Athan, Elisha and Joel and a host of aunts, uncles, cousins, and friends.
