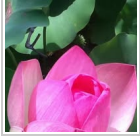

I met Jimmy in a huge teaching lecture Hall at Howard University Hospital in 2011... had gathered that night with a bunch of brilliant folks in DC who were followers of Dr Alyce Gullattee.

Dr Gullattee was working with some of the sickest of the sick in DC. She believed in the PROMISE of recovery and she was NOT willing

to throw ANY life away if they wanted to live. I was in the right place at the right time for once, and it did indeed SAVE my life.

Jimmy just seemed to adopt me! He had a sparkle in his eye and a JOY of living I could not explain. He always seem to make me laugh and he believed in me more than anyone else I had ever met.

Jimmy showed me how to live with as much freedom as possible by adopting these very basic ancient spiritual principles without compromising what I believed in...as a matter of fact, I got to base these simple principles in what EVER I believed at the moment, with so much FREEDOM to change what I believed in based on the results I got! That way, I was ALWAYS aligned with my internal belief system, so I NEVER surrendered to anything without full alignment to who I was and what I believed in the present moment. He taught me to lose my FEAR of looking at myself honestly without judgement or drama.

Jimmy was MORE than a friend...he was my FAMILY.
