It is with great sadness that the Park family announces the passing of beloved son and brother, Sergeant Jin Park of the Metropolitan Police Department of Washington, DC. He unexpectedly passed from a traffic accident during the early hours after his night shift on Friday, April 21, 2023.

Fulfilling his lifelong dream of becoming a law enforcement officer, he joined MPDC after graduating from John Jay College of Criminal Justice in New York City. He honorably served his community for 11 years, achieving the rank of Sergeant in 2018. Jin displayed his leadership and commitment to public safety during some of the most challenging times in our country's recent history. He was a role model to many and will be remembered for his sharp sense of humor, unwavering strength of character, and fierce dedication to family and friends.

He will be forever loved and missed by his mother Sung Park, father Seung Park, brother Paul Park, sister Minnie Park, sister-in-law Cathy Park, other family, friends, and his brothers and sisters in blue.
