A Time to be Born.... Mr. Lloyd E. McNair, son of the late Reverend Robert McNair, Sr. and Negolia Robinson McNair, was born on December 20, 1941 in Northampton County, North Carolina. He was the eighth of twelve children in the Robinson and McNair union.

A Time for Christian Discipleship... Lloyd was loved in a Christian home,

accepted Jesus Christ as his Lord and personal Savior, and was baptized at an early age. He joined Roanoke Chapel Baptist Church of Jackson, NC and later became a faithful member of Beulah Baptist Church of Deanwood Heights, Washington, DC.
