Sharon graduated from Duval Senior High School in 1971, where she was involved in Track and Field, Concert Choir and the Health Care Club. After 25 years, she left Doctors Community Hospital and embarked on a new journey working for the State of Maryland as a Psychiatric Nurse in 2001 at Spring Grove Medical Center in Catonsville, MD where she worked for 6 years. Sharon continued her career in Psychiatric Nursing at Shepherd-Pratt Hospital in Towson, MD in 2007. Sharon's last and final field of nursing landed her in long-term adult care at FutureCare Nursing Home facilities in Baltimore, MD. It was here at FutureCare where she was able to utilize all of her nursing skills and training that were developed throughout the years in order to mentor her fellow and upcoming nursing staff and also care for her patients that held a special place in her heart. Nursing was a part of every fiber of her being and she would always be just a phone call or a car trip away to offer medical advise, a helping hand or medical attention to family and friends.
