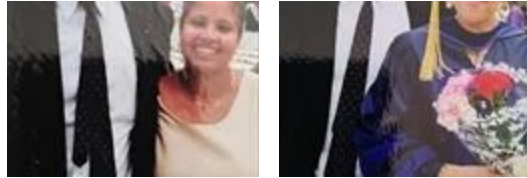

“Weaver, as I called her, used to share stories with us about her pets. She was so so funny. She used to tell us how they cohabitated, how she walked in on them sometime, and what they looked like they were saying to her when she interrupted them. She had us crying with laughter.

She used to say "the one with the most sense gotta act like it." She used to say she was "busier than a one-legged man in a dance contest." There were so many things she used to say that I will remember.

She loved children. Not only her own children and grandchildren whom she absolutely adored but the children of Ballou Senior High School as well. She helped so many children with clothing, housing, family problems. She became friends with the parents which built stronger relationships between her, the child, and family. I don't know exactly what she did but somehow she managed to establish very strong and loving ties with teenaged children and their parents. I asked her how she did it and she said just love them. She was sometimes treated unfairly by the Ballou staff at the time, but she managed to talk her way through whatever situation arose. My girl could talk!

We used to go to the river together. We used to take our burdens to the river and to the Lord and leave them there. Early in the morning before the sunrise we would put on white and go to the river making prayers and sacrifices of past indiscretions asking for cleansing and forgiveness. She loved the native American tradition. She loved the Lord and I made sure she was reminded of that whenever faced with trials. On her sick bed I reminded her often of who was in control and who actually was God. She liked that. She liked to be centered. It gave her a sense of peace and balance. I loved her interaction with nature - not only from a personal perspective but because of her knowledgeable and professional scientific approach to the love of nature as well.

She talked about her childhood friends with love and adoration. I like that. I believe for someone to keep friends that long says something special and beautiful about the person.

She loved, loved, loved music and that is one of the reasons she loved me. I was diagnosed with cancer around the same time as she so we were going through similar things and were able to talk about it. I will never forget asking her if she were afraid. She said yes. When she told me that i did everything in my power to say things to her to keep her from being afraid. She said "Yaz I want to see my grandchildren grow up." I said Weaver you will. You will be with them even more and be able to help them even more. You will be closer to them than ever before (if that is possible). She smiled and squeezed my hand. I gave her a book called "Dying to be Me". This book is designed to remove the fear of moving to the afterlife. The next time i asked her that question she said she was not afraid and that she had been in constant contact with God. We touched and agreed on that. The last time i saw her was at the hospice where I fed her chocolate ice cream, squeezed her her hand and she squeezed mine, and I kissed and kissed and kissed her. Each of my visits and conversations with her was to remind her to not be afraid, remind her of whose she was, remind her to allow people to love her as she has loved them, and no matter what the doctors said - if God said it was her time then it was her time - and not because of what the doctors said.

Every Christmas she would have a brunch and save some chocolate liqueur for me. It would be the only sip of anything remotely like alcohol that i would drink once a year. it used to crack her up.

I will more than miss my friend, but my love for her has now joined her in the flowers that bloom, in the sun that shines, in the birds that sing and in the river that flows. Weaver, "There Is A River."

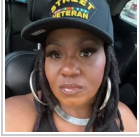

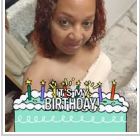
