Willie Glasco Mauldin was born on March 5, 1937 in Greensboro, Alabama to the late Jimmie Lee Mauldin and Gladys Wilson Mauldin. After completing his high school education, he enlisted in the United States Army doing most of his service tour in Germany. Willie received an honorable discharge on January 31, 1962. Upon his return to Alabama, he married Ethel Lois Croom and they relocated to Washington, DC. They were blessed with 3 daughters - Deborah, Barbara, and Michelle.

Willie had a long and fulfilling Federal career. He spent many years in his last job with the Department of Defense working for the US Army Corps of Engineers as an Information Management Specialist. He retired with 41 ½ years and was free to enjoy time with family and friends. His work ethic was impeccable and he followed that in all he did whether work, school, church, or just day to day life.

Willie joined Rehoboth Baptist Church on May 7, 1970 and remained a loyal and faithful member until his passing, showing continuous commitment and support of the church and Pastor.
